For the peace of the whole world, for the well-being of the church of God, and for the unity of all, let us pray to the Lord. Lord, have mercy.






PRAYER OF THE DAY

The holy gospel according to Mark, the sixteenth chapter. **Glory to you, O Lord.**

NICENE CREED


The people may greet one another with a sign of Christ's peace on video or say: "Peace be with you" from wherever you are or type it in the chat or comments.

through Jesus Christ, our risen Lord.


