Pentecost Sunday May 23, 2021

Welcome, All, In the Name of Jesus Christ our Lord!

Fifty days after Easter, we celebrate the outpouring of the Holy Spirit on Pentecost. Crossing all boundaries that would separate us, the Spirit brings the wideness of God's mercy to places we least expect it—to a crowd of strangers of different lands and tongues, to dry bones, to our weak hearts. Jesus promises his disciples that they will be accompanied by the Holy Spirit, and that this Spirit reveals the truth. We celebrate that we too have been visited with this same Spirit. Guided by the truth, we join together in worship, and then disperse to share the fullness of Christ's love with the world.

READING: Acts 2:1-21

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles.

¹When the day of Pentecost had come, [the apostles] were all together in one place. ²And suddenly from heaven there came a sound like the rush of a violent wind, and it filled the entire house where they were sitting. ³Divided tongues, as of fire, appeared among them, and a tongue rested on each of

them. ⁴All of them were filled with the Holy Spirit and began to speak in other languages, as the Spirit gave them ability.

⁵Now there were devout Jews from every nation under heaven living in Jerusalem. ⁶And at this sound the crowd gathered and was bewildered, because each one heard them speaking in the native language of each. ⁷Amazed and astonished, they asked, “Are not all these who are speaking Galileans? ⁸And how is it that we hear, each of us, in our own native language? ⁹Parthians, Medes, Elamites, and residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, ¹⁰Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya belonging to Cyrene, and visitors from Rome, both Jews and proselytes, ¹¹Cretans and Arabs—in our own languages we hear them speaking about God’s deeds of power.” ¹²All were amazed and perplexed, saying to one another, “What does this mean?” ¹³But others sneered and said, “They are filled with new wine.”

¹⁴But Peter, standing with the eleven, raised his voice and addressed them, “Men of Judea and all who live in Jerusalem, let this be known to you, and listen to what I say. ¹⁵Indeed, these are not drunk, as you suppose, for it is only nine o’clock in the morning. ¹⁶No, this is what was spoken through the prophet Joel:

¹⁷“In the last days it will be, God declares,
that I will pour out my Spirit upon all flesh,
and your sons and your daughters shall prophesy,
and your young men shall see visions,
and your old men shall dream dreams.

You know him, because he abides with you, and he will be in you.

²⁵“I have said these things to you while I am still with you. ²⁶But the Advocate, the Holy Spirit, whom the Father will send in my name, will teach you everything, and remind you of all that I have said to you. ²⁷Peace I leave with you; my peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Do not let your hearts be troubled, and do not let them be afraid.”

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RITE OF CONFIRMATION (AFFIRMATION OF BAPTISM)

Emily Richards, Ford Turner

May 23, 2021

PRESENTATION

Pastor Christina meets the confirmands at the chancel steps.

I present Emily Richards and Ford Turner, who desire to make public affirmation of their baptism.

Have you been baptized in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit?

[Confirmands] I have.

Pastor and the confirmands stand in the chancel, surrounded by those who are supporting their decision to affirm their Christian faith.

PROFESSION OF FAITH

Are you ready with your own mouth and your own heart to affirm your faith in Jesus Christ?

[Confirmands] I am.

Pastor asks those supporting the confirmands:

Do you believe that Emily and Ford have been carefully prepared in their understanding of God's grace and love through our Savior Jesus Christ?

[Parents and other supporters] We do.

Do you believe that they ready to affirm the promises God made to them at Baptism—love, forgiveness, and eternal life?

[Parents and other supporters] We do.

Do you believe that they ready to take on more responsibility for their faith through worship, study, and service?

[Parents and other supporters] We do.

RENUNCIATION OF EVIL

In Baptism, God calls us from darkness into his marvelous light. To follow Christ means dying to sin and rising to new life with Him. Do you renounce the devil and all the forces that defy God?

[Confirmands] I renounce them.

Do you renounce the powers of this world that draw you from God?

[Confirmands] I renounce them.

[P] Do you renounce the ways of sin that draw you from God?

[Confirmands] I renounce them.

Let us profess together with these candidates the faith of the whole Christian Church in the words of the Apostles' Creed.

I believe in God the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord. He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit, and born of the virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended into hell. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.

THE CONFIRMATION

Our help is in the name of the Lord.

Who made heaven and earth.

Blessed be the name of the Lord.

Now and forever. Amen.

Almighty and everlasting God, whose Son Jesus Christ was crucified and rose again to break the power of sin and death: we give you thanks and praise for the gift of your Holy Spirit, by whom your servants receive new life today. Grant that in the power of your Holy Spirit, these children of God will continue to grow in faith. Make their spiritual gifts aware to them and to all of us. Grant them the spirit of wisdom and understanding, the spirit of right judgment and inward strength, the spirit of knowledge and godly living, and fill them with the spirit of reverence and love for You.

Each confirmand is called up separately to kneel at the foot of the altar.

Family and friends may join the confirmand and lay their hands on the confirmand as the pastor prays.

Emily and Ford, God has called you by name at Baptism and made you His own child.

Confirm, dear Lord, your servant: Emily/Ford, with your heavenly grace, that s/he will continue to be your servant, and daily increase in your Holy Spirit more and more until he enters your eternal kingdom.

The pastor marks the confirmand with holy oil in the name of the Father and of the Son and of the Holy Spirit.

Heavenly Father, we pray for your servants, Emily and Ford, upon whom we have now laid our hands and anointed them, following the example of the apostles, to assure them by this sign of your favor toward them. May your hand always be over them. Let your Holy Spirit always be with them. Lead them to know and to follow your words and then embrace them into eternal life. Amen.

THE COMMISSION

Those who are baptized are called to worship and serve God. Will you continue to follow the teachings of Jesus through fellowship, prayer, and the breaking of the bread in Holy Communion?

[Confirmands] I will.

Will you continue to resist evil, but when you do fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

[Confirmands] I will.

Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God through Jesus Christ?

[Confirmands] I will.

Will you serve Jesus through all people, loving your neighbor as yourself?

[Confirmands] I will.

People of God, you have heard our sister Emily and our brother Ford respond to the goodness of our Lord Jesus Christ who called them at Baptism to be partners with God in life and ministry. Do you support and pray for one another in your life in Christ?

We do, and we ask God to help and guide us.

The Rite of Confirmation is ended and the congregation may applaud.
