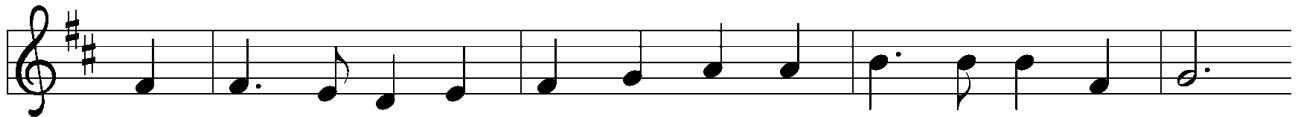

## **SENDING OF HOME COMMUNION**
